Dear Mr Roman Golovchenko,

I write to you on behalf of the AFL-CIO and our 12.5 million members. The AFL-CIO notes with considerable alarm the arrest and detention of 17 trade union leaders in Belarus in recent days. Among those detained are the top leaders of country's independent trade union movement including Aleksandr Yarashuk, President of the Belarusian Congress of Democratic Trade Unions (BKDP) and Sergei Antusevich, Vice-President of the BKDP. The offices of the BKDP have been closed as have the offices of its four affiliated unions. Top elected leaders from among the BKDP's affiliates and other activists and legal experts are among the others arrested and detained.


This renewed repression follows the April 7, 2022, decision by your government to label the BKDP-affiliated Belarusian Trade Union of Radio-Electronic Industry Workers (REP) an extremist organization and ban its activities.

These leaders and the unions they represent make up the core of the independent trade union movement in Belarus. These unions have for decades sought to promote worker rights in the face of continual harassment and repression by the Belarus government. The government of Belarus has been repeatedly called out by the International Labor Organization (ILO) for its systematic violations of freedom of association and core labor standards.

These recent arrests represent a troubling increase in anti-union harassment in your country. The AFL-CIO joins with the international trade union movement in its [protest](#) of these arrests and stands in solidarity with our partner unions in Belarus. We call for the immediate release of all those detained and for resumption of the activities of the BKDP and its affiliate unions.

We anticipate your prompt reply and action.
